Now what else is important to Bowlers? oh yes I remember the Club Bar! As you know Bernie has taken over as Bar Manager and I have asked him to give the following update on what he has been up to:

"The culmination of discussions, thoughts and trying to save money for the Club has brought about the following changes to the Bar.....

➢ After complaints about the flat beer (Courage Best) I have investigated the alternatives. At the same cost, our Suppliers now provide John Smiths Smooth, offering a 'smooth tap' and a 'less smooth' if people don't like the smooth/creamy head. It is proving very popular on Darts nights!

> The Syrup dispensing System has been stripped out and stored in the shed in case somebody wants it. In the end it was only providing Soda Water as the supply of syrups ceased. I have replaced the system with a 'help yourself' Soda Syphon, on the Bar, together with a backup supply of bottled Soda Water.

> Daniel wore the old Ice maker out and it has packed up. Not even Malcolm has been able to repair it so he recommended buying a new one. A few conversations later, after he reported that the machine had been black inside from use and failure, we quickly came to the conclusion that we would be better off with a Table top Freezer.

Terry V and I altered the Bar shelving and as from last week we are now able to provide Ice again. A new Insulated Ice Bucket has also been provided with Tongs and this will be on the bar to be filled as and when needed.

➤ Savings /Running Costs have been achieved by the introduction of the following measures:

(i) The Gas for the Lager and Beer Kegs, which are dissimilar, has now been reduced to 2 Bottles (one of each) from 4 originally. These are on Rent from BOC.

When the John Smiths was re-piped new Pressure Gauges were installed which now indicate how much gas remains in each bottle. Therefore it is no longer 'hit and miss' and we should be able to order new Gas at the last minute quite accurately thereby reducing the rent.

(ii) The Cooler in the Bar Store has been switched off for weeks now as the Cold Weather enables the Store to remain at a cool enough temperature to keep the products stable. The intention is to install a Timeswitch for its' operation in the Summer since the Line Cooler is oversized and easily copes with the Beer and Lager pipe cooling.

The saving in Electricity has already pleased our illustrious Treasurer not an easy task in itself!

(iii) Lighting use in the bar has also been reduced by leaving the middle row of lights off (marked for Bar Staff) as the levels are more than enough without them being on all the time.

(iv) The new Freezer will not only be more hygienic but also more efficient and reliable and avoid having to buy bags of ice from Bookers

➤ I have yet to finally decide which lines can be stopped and which will continue. For a Bowls Club we stock too many different lines some of which sit in the Coolers for ages before expiring and being thrown away. Obviously the Bar needs to operate efficiently and make money for the Club and I hope this reappraisal of what we need to stock will help sales. Compared to most other Bowls Clubs our Bar has always been of a very high standard and this will not change.

➢ During March the Bar Committee will meet to not only adjust the proposed stock lines but also review our prices. You will all be only too aware of the recent rise in VAT which has increased our costs and whilst we have held our prices for 2 years we will clearly have to increase them this year. However rest assured we will not be looking to drive people away by being greedy.

➢ Finally, if anyone has any ideas as to how we can improve the Bar, or its service, then please let me know.

Anyone who wishes to help by working behind the Bar during the year will be very welcome so again please let me know. It is a crucial part of the Club fundraising so please do help if you can.
